The 4th Sunday of Easter Year C, also known as Good Shepherd Sunday, focuses on Jesus as our caring and guiding Shepherd. 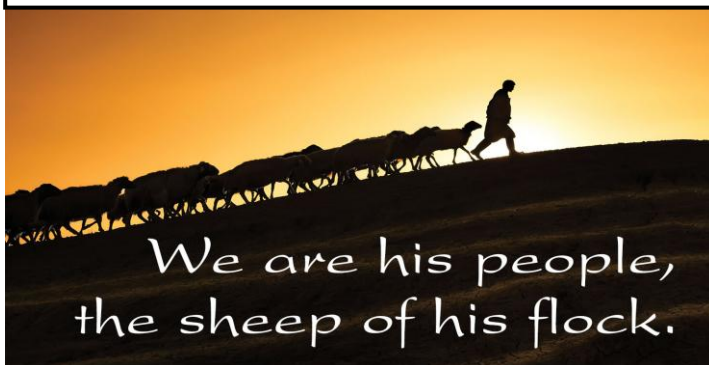




