Sprinkler System Repair

In December, we discovered leaks within the sprinkler system were discovered in the wall behind the Parish Hall and in the attic. Fortunately, these were identified early before any damage occurred. John E. Green Company initially installed patches and returned in January to complete the permanent repairs. During the repair they created two openings in the Parish Hall walls. They were able to install the new pipes through these holes. After the repair Jim Morse completed the necessary drywall repairs to this area and repainted to fully restore the area. They were also to fully repair the leak in the attic as well.
